



Bequests are a lasting way to make a significant impact and support the Climate Emergency Fund's mission. They provide a number of benefits and create a legacy far into the future. Always be sure to consult a legal advisor when considering a planned gift. There are a number of ways you and your attorneys can choose to make your bequest:

Specific- Leave a specific set dollar amount or property.

Percentage- Leave a percentage of your overall estate- enables your bequests to grow as your assets grow.

Residual- Ensures all other legacies are paid first before leaving a percentage of the residue.

Contingent- Made only in the event the primary bequest cannot be met.

Below is sample language to assist you and your attorney in naming Climate Emergency Fund as a beneficiary:

Percentage

I hereby give, devise and bequeath ____ percent (____%) of my total estate, determined as of the date of my death, to Climate Emergency Fund, a nonprofit organization located at 8383 Wilshire Blvd #400, Beverly Hills, CA 90211, Federal Tax ID #84-2151545, for Climate Emergency Fund's general use and purpose.

Residual

I hereby give, devise and bequeath to Climate Emergency Fund, a nonprofit organization located at 8383 Wilshire Blvd #400, Beverly Hills, CA 90211, Federal Tax ID #84-2151545, ALL OR A PERCENTAGE of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate to be used for Climate Emergency Fund's general use and purpose.

Contingent

If PRIMARY BENEFICIARY does not survive me, then I hereby give, devise and bequeath to Climate Emergency Fund, a nonprofit organization located at 8383 Wilshire Blvd #400, Beverly Hills, CA 90211, Federal Tax ID #84-2151545, DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY to be used for Climate Emergency Fund's general use and purpose.
